- Our target is to deliver a minimum of 9GW of capacity as agreed with the Crown Estate

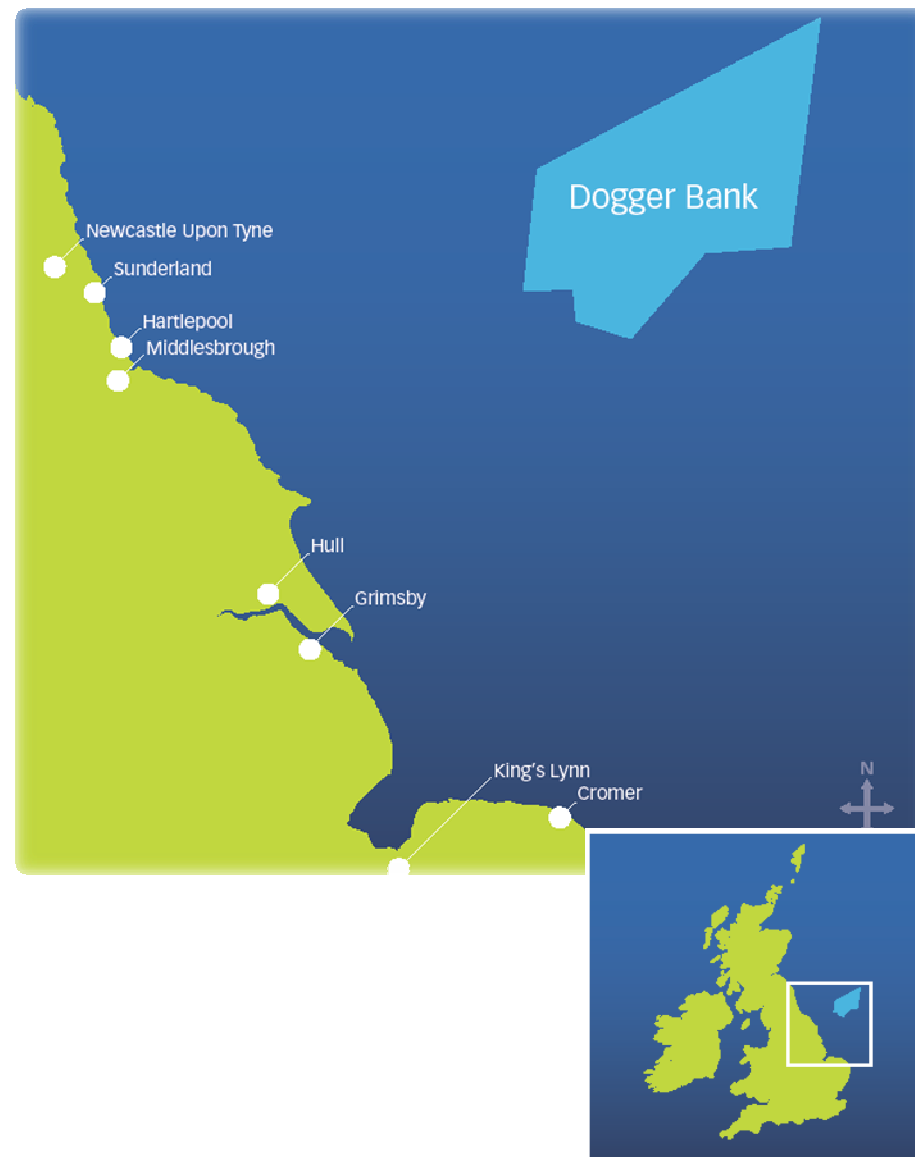


Financially-viable, buildable, and safe offshore wind farm projects on Dogger Bank.

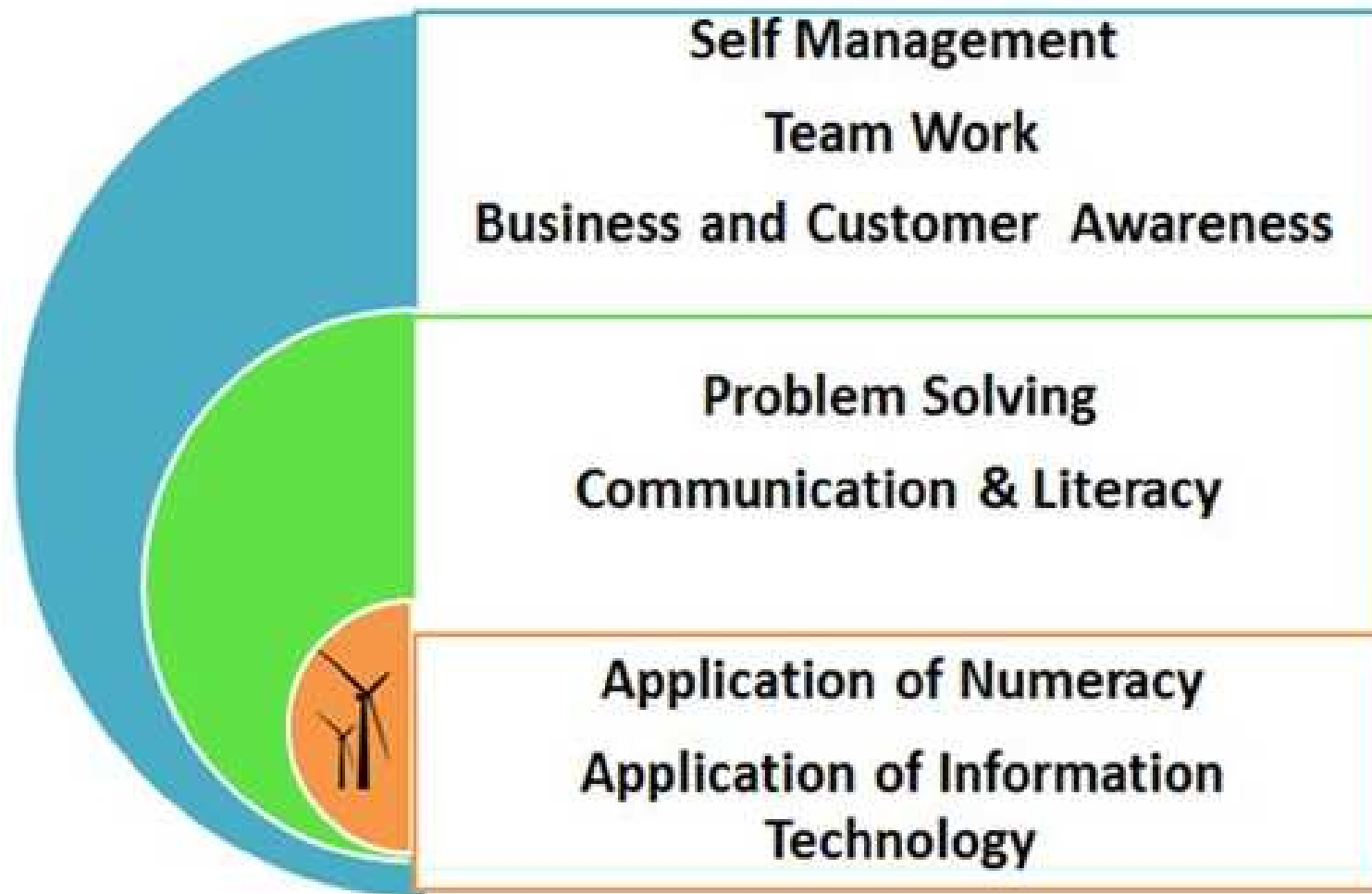
Dogger Bank – key facts



- Capacity: Agreed target 9 GW, with the potential for c.13 GW. Equivalent to 10% of UK demand.
- Zone area: 8660km² ; equivalent to size of North Yorkshire.
- Distance: 125-290 km from shore.
- Depth: 18-63 m; c.4 GW in <30m water depth, c.8 GW in <35m water depth; shallow compared with other Round 3 zones.
- Wind: High wind speeds of >10 m/s average wind speed across the zone.
- History: A "dogger" was a type of Dutch fishing boat that commonly worked in the North Sea in the seventeenth century.

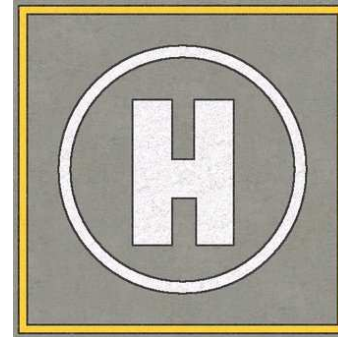
Enterprise Zones Map

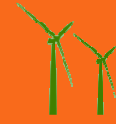
