1 Introduction

1.1 Legislative framework

- 1.1.1 This document is provided by Forewind Limited in relation to the application for development consent for the Dogger Bank Teesside A & B offshore wind farms.
- 1.1.2 Section 48 of the Planning Act 2008 sets out a requirement for the applicant to publicise any proposed application in the prescribed manner. Regulation 4 of the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 provides further detail on the content and extent of the notifications required.
- 1.1.3 This document is submitted under Regulation 5(2)(q) of the Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) Regulations 2009 as a document necessary to support to application, in order to show compliance with the legislation. All newspaper notices are also displayed in the Consultation Report (document reference 5.1).

Regulation 4, The Infrastructure Planning (Applications: Prescribed Forms and Procedure) **Regulations 2009**

Notice of the proposed application for a development consent order (DCO) to construct and operate the offshore wind development Dogger Bank Teesside A & B, including onshore infrastructure in the Borough of Redcar and Cleveland.

- 1. Notice is hereby given that Forewind Limited (Forewind) of 55 Vastern Road, Reading, Berkshire, RG1 8BU intends to apply to the Secretary of State under section 37 of the Planning Act 2008 ("the Act") for a development consent order (DCO) to authorise the construction and operation of the Dogger Bank Teesside A & B offshore wind development ("the Development").
- Dogger Bank Teesside A & B is the second stage of development of the Dogger Bank Zone in the North Sea (the first stage being Dogger Bank Creyke Beck). It comprises two offshore wind farm arrays (Dogger Bank Teesside A and Dogger Bank Teesside B) each with a generating capacity of up to 1.2 gigawatts and associated infrastructure. Dogger Bank Teesside A array is 560km² in area and 196 kilometres at its closest point from the coast. Dogger Bank Teesside B array is 593km² in area and 165 kilometres at its closest point from the coast. Given that the generating capacity of the Development is more than 100 megawatts, an application for development consent is required to be made to the Secretary of State under the provisions of the Act.
- 3. Forewind's proposed application to the Secretary of State seeks development consent for the construction and operation of both Dogger Bank Teesside A and Dogger Bank Teesside B. The proposals include export cables that will connect the offshore wind farm arrays to the UK on the Teesside coast between Redcar and Marske-by-the-Sea; and onshore cables from the coast to the converter stations and substation near the Wilton Complex. All onshore works are located in the Borough of Redcar and Cleveland.
- 4. Dogger Bank Teesside A & B, comprising Dogger Bank Teesside A and Dogger Bank Teesside B, will combined incorporate the following elements:

Offshore

- Up to 400 wind turbines with supporting tower structures, foundations fixed to the seabed and associated support and access structures:
- Two offshore high voltage direct current (HVDC). converter platforms with foundations fixed to the seabed;
- Up to eight offshore collector platforms with foundations fixed to the seabed;
- Up to four offshore accommodation or helicopter platforms with foundations fixed to the seabed and including facilities for vessels and helicopters for operations and maintenance activities;
- Offshore platforms may be co-joined to create a combined platform, resulting in a combined offshore platform comprising two or more of the platform structures described above;
- Up to ten offshore meteorological monitoring stations with foundations fixed to the seabed;
- Subsea cables between the elements of offshore infrastructure described above;
- Offshore export cables carrying electricity from the offshore HVDC converter platforms to the Teesside coast; and
- Ancillary works including: cable and pipeline crossing structures; protection against foundation scour and subsea damage, cable protection measures and vessel-mooring facilities.

Onshore in the Borough of Redcar and Cleveland

- Underground cable transition joint bays at the landfall, located between Redcar and Marske-by-the-Sea on the Teesside coast;
- Underground HVDC export cables running approximately seven kilometres from the landfall joint bays to the two converter stations;
- Two converter stations located within the Wilton Complex, with associated access, fencing, landscaping and drainage;
- Underground high voltage alternating current (HVAC) export cables running approximately two kilometres from the converter stations to the existing National Grid substation at Lackenby, where connection works will be carried out;
- Ancillary works including: temporary working areas, permanent and temporary access roads, and service corridors.
- 5. The DCO will include a number of other provisions. including those which:
- authorise the compulsory purchase of land and rights over land, if necessary, to construct and maintain the Development;
- allow all or part of the benefit and rights of the DCO to be transferred to other person(s); and
- provide for deemed Marine Licences.
- 6. The Development is "EIA development" for the purposes of The Infrastructure Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) Regulations 2009. This means that the proposed works require an Environmental Impact Assessment and the proposed application will therefore be accompanied by an Environmental Statement.

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Consultation starts on Dogger Bank Teesside A&B

The final phase of pre-application consultation for offshore wind consortium Forewind's second stage of offshore wind energy development, Dogger Bank Teesside A & B began on Monday November 4.

The consultation, which starts with the publication of documents, plans and maps about the proposed development, will run for seven weeks until Friday 20 December. It will include a series of public events to be held in venues near the proposed landfall and cable route, at Redcar and Lazenby.

Dogger Bank Teesside A & B will comprise two up to 1.2GW offshore wind farms which will connect via underground cables into the national grid at the existing Lackenby substation, in Redcar and Cleveland. Two new converter stations are also proposed for the south-western corner of the Wilton Complex.

With a total installed capacity of up to 2.4GW, it has the potential to generate around 8 terawatt hours (TWh) of green power every year, which is equivalent to the electricity used annually by approximately 1.8 million British homes.

This consultation is the culmination of more than three years of work including onshore and offshore environmental and engineering surveys, consultation and technical assessments. The documents to be published include the draft Environmental Statement and a Non-Technical Summary giving an overview of the project, its potential impacts and proposed mitigation.

Forewind Project Manager Chris Nunn said it is the main opportunity for stakeholders, including the members of the public, to view and comment on the proposals before the consent application is submitted. "The aim of this consultation is to gather views and feedback on the proposals, and give those with an interest in the project another opportunity

to influence the way Dogger Bank Teesside A & B is developed," he said.

Forewind's consultation documents will be available to view at local libraries during the consultation period, and to download from www.forewind.co.uk along with electronic feedback forms.

There will be three public events in November enabling stakeholders, in particular the community living or working near the proposed onshore cable route and converter stations, to learn all about the project and submit their comments. Forewind staff will be on hand to answer questions and discuss the proposals.
